6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- 1. Each department reviews its curriculum every year to make sure that it is as per the industry demand and current research trends
- 2. Faculty members are encouraged to suggest changes in the current curriculum of their respective subjects.
- 3. Interesting suggestions are taken forward in BoS which is composed of senior faculty members of dept., industry experts and invited experts
- 4. Board of Studies (BOS) meeting held every semester for syllabus revision/restructuring /electives and sent to AC for approval.
- 5. AC at University level examines the proposal sent by BoS and approves/disapproves it.
- 6. Major restructuring of any course if required is carried out only after 3 years of successful running.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- 1. Faculty members are required to prepare a Teaching Plan for the lab as well as lectures for their respective subject before the beginning of each academic session. The Teaching Plan should also include topics and experiments beyond the syllabus
- 2. Faculties are encouraged to upgrade their skills and knowledge through short-term training programmes/workshops/seminars/online courses like NPTL.
- 3. Faculties are encouraged to use ICT based learning resources and advised to prepare learning material like PPT, hands-out, class-notes, assignments etc.
- 4. Most of the subjects are backed up with a considerable amount of lab assignments to emphasize practical knowledge and field exposure along with the theoretical foundation.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- 1. The University adopts the phylosophy of continuous teaching continuous evaluations. Each academic session is divided into three phases. An internal exam is hold after every phase with one third syllabus for continuous evaluation. - 2. Remedial and Re-remedial exams are conducted to give second and third chances to weak students. It is compulsory for all the students to clear all subjects of current academic session by the end of next academic session.
- 3. The University prepares the academic calendar with date of all exams along with date of results in the beginning of academic year only and it is strictly adhered to.
- 4. At the end of internal examinations students are shown corrected answer sheets so that they can evaluate themselves and can get the idea how to overcome their lacuna. On demand students can see their evaluated answer books for the University Examinations.
- 5. Multiple sets of question paper are drawn by team of internal and external examiners.
- 6. Process is adopted to identify weak students (based on their performance in internal exams) and counselling with faculty members is arranged to bring their performance to acceptable

#### Best practices in Infrastructure and learning resources

The University has continued its practice of central planning of all development work with detailed input from the Civil Engineering Department of the Faculty of Technology, all levels of which benefits from the experience as well.

That this approach improves the quality while it brings down the costs in each head of execution, is an added benefit.

The University has also advised the nearby Hostel facilities in improving their facilities to the benefit of the students.

Significant improvement is being planned in the Libraries of various faculties and departments.

The addition of the Faculty of Medical Research is a milestone not just for the University but for the entire Nadiad city and enirons.

The University is in the process of formalizing a programme of continuous renovation of facilities especially the furniture.

#### **Annexure II**

#### Best practices in Teaching, learning and Evaluations

#### Teaching Process:

The University has a robust process of Curriculum Development, with Workshops being the mainstay. The workshops have contribution from senior faculty members, outside academic experts, industry experts, and alumni. These Workshops are held in all the faculties, and are attended by all faculty members.

The process finally takes into account student feedback as well, to ensure the linkage with learning.

The objective of the process is to create syllabi which are relevant, and can be completed in the stipulated semester time.

Thereafter, faculty members take up their lesson plans, and the development of lecture notes and presentations/ demonstrations.

Since the process is done every year, as a corollary, the process leads to the faculty members continuously finding newer ways of making the course relevant and interesting.

<u>Learning Process</u>: Improvements in the Teaching Process has automatic impact on the learning process, at least in the classroom, since all the work is done with the learning in mind.

Similarly, the timetable preparation is done in a method which leads to the maximum utilisation of the day, considering the classroom and laboratory facilities, which has the added benefit of keeping the student attentive and receptive.

The University also holds regular remedial sessions for students who require extra help. This is preceded by identifying any special needs. Further, the University also holds additional classes and programmes for preparing students for competitive exams. Apart from this, the University also pays great attention to learning beyond the classroom. Students are encouraged to take part in various activities outside of the classroom, like workshops inside and outside the University, competitions, presentations, seminars etc. Our Alumni association is generous in providing students with TA/DA for attending such programmes, which provides students with learning in managing such events as well.

Evaluation Process: The Course Committees in each Department decide on the weightages of various components, which are communicated to the students well in advance so they are spared of any stress. Enough discussion is held with them as well, so as to guide them over any issues. In the End-semester examinations in all subjects, half of the paper is invariably prepared and evaluated by an outside examiner. For courses where an oral or viva-voce examination is held at the end of the semester, outside experts are invariably invited for such examination, to ensure the quality of the examination, as well as to give the student a feel of the connection between his or her work and the real world.

#### **Annexure III**

#### Research, Consultancy

The Board of Research at the University has been laying down the process of promoting research work by the teaching faculty and researchers. This has led to a great interest in research and development work across all departments.

Apart from such University-wide programme, the University has also established full-fledged R & D Centro in the area of Information and Communications Technology, and for Surface Sciences and Nanotechnologies. These undertake specialized and very advanced work in their respective areas. Undergraduates are also encouraged to take up their final semester project work to take up their topics in these centers, to make for synergy.

Due to its long-standing reputation, the University has also been able to have its students take up projects with advanced and hi-tech organisations like BISSAG, IPR, SAC-ISRO, PRL, TRDDC, as well as many other industrial research organisations like Reliance Industries Ltd., IIT Bombay, etc.

These institutions also provide many projects for the PG students as well, thus making the entire effort a win-win process.

Professional bodies in various discipline like ISTE, CSI and IEEE have found deep roots at the University. The University has its own student branches of CSI and ISTE.

A Clinical Materials Research Laboratory has been established in the Faculty of Dental Science has to encourage its faculty and students.

The University has online subscription of IEEE journal and conference papers, Science, Direct and Online Subscription of ASCE JNL.

Research is promoted in novel ways also. Faculty of Dental Science has adopted a General Hospital of Uttarsanda a nearby village, where faculty members provide dental treatment to village people. In the process, they come to know of many problems at the very initial stage itself, since they go to the symptoms rather than wait for the symptoms to come to them, by which it is often too late.

All this work in isolation is not enough. Recognizing this, the University has actively pursued networking with other like-minded serious and capable organizations, by entering into several MOUs with different organizations to facilitate various activities like research, extension, consultancy, faculty exchange and development, students training and placement etc.

#### 3) Faculty Development:

For Faculty development action plan in **2018-2019** is as under.

- 2. To depute 29 faculty for higher education. [2016-17-27].
- 3. We have at present 33 faculty with Doctorate Degree and expect that in year 17-18, the number of Doctorate Degree holders will be not less than 33. The number of faculty perusing PHD course is 23 & will be not less than 23 in 2017-18. We encourage faculties for higher studies including for Doctorate courses. We also have 42 faculties who have M Phil / Tech / Master degree. In 18-19 the number will be over 42.
- 4. To arrange 85 expert lectures in 2017-18 as against 66 lectures in 2017-2018.
- 5. To arrange 68 Industry visits as against 47 in 2017-2018 with participation of 68 faculty members [2016-17 47] and 1620 students [2016-17 1217].
- 6. To encourage our faculty / students to take advantage of Inter Institutional Networking set up under TEQIP. The Inter Institutional Networking, gives access to faculty/students through E-Mail etc., to subject experts in various institutions having Memorandum of Understanding with D. D. University.
- 7. To encourage faculty to write research articles in journals. It is planned to have 91 Research Articles by Faculty [2016-17-65], consisting of 51 in International Journals [2016-17. –41] & 40 research articles in national journal s [2016-17-24].
- 8. To encourage faculty to take part in seminars / conferences & present papers etc.
- 9. It is planned to substantially raise participation by faculty in Seminars / Conferences.
- 10. Fourteen faculties earned distinction of occupying chair in seminars/conferences/ Competitions in year in 18-19.
- 11. Our faculty members have written 13 books in year 2017-2018]. In year 2017-18, at least 13 books are expected to be written.
- 12. It is also planned to associate more & more faculties with consultation / Testing & R&D assignments to give them exposure to Industry / Market requirements.
- 13. D.D. University plans to have as many as 158 training programmes in 2017-18 [2016-17-134] to impart training to students, faculties & others.

#### 4) Student Development:

For student Development the action plan is as under;

To encourage students in all disciplines to organize more & more Students' events with participation at state level, National level & International level Programmes, and incorporating research paper presentation, technical competitive games, squeezes etc. In year 2016-17, student events were 100 with Participation of 3481 students. It is planned to have 114 events with participation of over 3800 students in 2017-18. Paper Presentation and giving seminar by students is also being encouraged in the events. Students from D.D. University participate in various competition also. Efforts will be made to ensure more & more students' participation & their better performance in 2018 –19 in various other activities, as under to ensure their all round development.

1. Sports & Cultural activities. In 2016-17,1143students participated in sports & 1313 students participated in cultural activities. In 2017-18 It is planned to have student participation in sports at 1385 & in cultural activities to 1562.

- 2. More & more industry visits.: Our University organized 23 Industrial visits with participation of 1217 students & 47faculty in Year 2016-17. It is planned to raise the visits to 34 with participation of 1620 students & 68 faculties in 2017-18.

As regards learning resources it is proposed to have new books in 2018-2019 [In 2016-17, books were purchased]. In Four years ending 31-3-2016, D.D. University has spent no less than 43 crores for infrastructure Development It will meet all its infrastructure requirements for 18-19 from its own resources and ensure that there is no problem in that regard in any discipline/Department what so ever.

D.D. University has already set up Two colleges for new disciplines of Dentistry & Pharmacy. It is proposed to set up a fully equipped ultra-modern hospital in 2018-2019 as a first step towards setting up Medical Discipline.

Competition in the area has intensified due to efforts of various Universities & Institutes to obtain assignments from Industry. D D U has decided to make all out efforts to maintain /enhance the number/amount/areas of assignments. In 2016-17 the income from the activity was Rs. 174 lacs. In 2018-2019 the income is planned to be raised to Rs. 190 lacs.

D.D. University has been, at most reasonable rates, giving service to the community in the area of Dental health care by providing facility of ultra-modern dental hospital with well qualified & experienced doctors.

Dental discipline has been holding camps to cater to need of society for dental care. Large Number of students & faculty have been participating in camps. The Dental Hospital has become very popular with larger & larger number of people availing its services. In 2017-18 it is planned to serve 130000 patients [2016-17-117000] for dental care. For other medical health care areas, the number of patients is planned to be raised to 4560 In 18-19 [in 2016-17 – 3930].


